

Kariyarra is part of the Pama-Nyungan language family; a large group of languages spread over much of the Australian continent. It belongs to the Ngayarta subgroup of languages along with Nyamal, Palyku, Banjima, Kurrama, Yindjibarndi, Ngarluma, Ngarla, Nhuwala, Martuthunira, Jurruru and possibly Yaburarra. The Kariyarra language is closely related to Ngarluma, with which it shares a substantial amount of vocabulary as well as grammatical and phonological features. Some linguists regard Kariyarra as a dialect of Ngarluma.

Kariyarra is an endangered language.

Past spellings and names of Kariyarra include Kariera, Kariara, Kayera, Gariera, Kaierra, Karriarra and Kyeara.
