BUNGARUN HERITAGE TRAIL

The Berndt Museum and five past residents were contacted to share photos and statements. With formal permission granted, these have been included into the signage design to produce an authentic record of the meaning and values of the site. The lives of the Aboriginal people who lived and worked at the site are to be celebrated, preserving an enduring legacy for future generations and an appropriate and memorable visitor experience.

All involved in the collection and collation of information prioritised the provision of public interpretation as enduring, becoming part of the fabric of the site and authenticity of the experience of the place. This included interviewing former patients of Bungarun Leprosarium, designing and preparing text and artwork for the signage, ensuring the overall design was appropriate through consultation with The Cultural Manager and past residents, design of the layout of the installation within the ground of the signs including mud maps, photographs, aerial views and many visits to the site.

Winun Ngari Aboriginal Corporation provided the project management support which involved coordinating and planning the maintenance, restoration, preservation and heritage of Bungarun including the grant management. This continues with Winun Ngari Employment Services providing the CDP Activity support through maintaining of the area, job seekers being trained and gaining experience on site while under supervision.

The production of the signs took place locally and were installed as a collaboration with CDP participants involved in the Bungarun Heritage Trail Project.

We understand there's been some confusion surrounding how Post Office Boxes operate at the Derby Post Office. In no way is it a requirement to rent a PO Box but by doing so you stand to benefit from the convenience of being able to collect your mail 24/7 without ID, use of the hatch to collect parcels and not having to line up at the counter. The only way to collect mail in Derby is at the post office, as we do not have street delivery. Australia Post renews PO Boxes every 1st of June after two renewal notices and a final notice that if it is not renewed all mail will be abandoned and returned to sender. PO Boxes that aren't renewed will become locked as a friendly reminder, it will not stop you from receiving mail, you will just need to collect it from the front counter after providing ID.

REMOTE INDIGENOUS BUSINESS INCUBATOR

Winun Ngari Arts spent an intensive 4 days with jeweller and marketing whiz, Cynthia from Totomoto Designs where they tested the materials, concepts and products in practice. They took an experimental and practical approach in order to find our footing with the direction of their small business. The women are embracing the space provided growing and thriving while in this space. The artists will be at The Strong Women Business Gathering running a screen printing workshop and a stall at the night markets. All product is hand-made in Derby WA by local Indigenous women.

With the guidance of Andrew Conlon from Alliance Training, the 14 students have been attending the last 4 weeks, completing the required written units.

Over the next week the fun begins for them with hands on experience with the machines, which will include Grader, Roller, Front End Loader, Skid Steer and excavator.

They will be operating these machines on a worksite in Fitzroy Street – Clearing and levelling approximately 10 acres.

During the course they will also acquire a White Card and Traffic Management Ticket (With TAFE) and for those who qualify, a HR learners and a Main Roads induction.

I am sure that with the dedication shown by these participants, they will gain employment once the course is completed.
