CDP SUCCESS CONTINUES WITH SHAUN TAYLOR

Shaun Taylor was a CDP participant who did not want to be on the dole forever. He sent out his CV to gain employment for any available roles in the region.

Through an interview process, Shaun was selected in 2017 to commence full time work under a 12 month contract between Winun Ngari Aboriginal Corporation, Derby West Kimberley Shire, and H & M Tracey Construction Ltd to help rebuild the Derby airport & airstrip. During Shaun's employment he gained experience and skills in Civil Construction, Infrastructure, Plumbing, Landscaping, Fire Safety and First Aid, and qualified with Cert 3 Construction and Cert 2 Metalliferous Mining Operations as well as all certificates needed for construction site work.

In June 2018 Shaun completed his certificate of accreditation in 'Traffic Management - Traffic Control' with competency units in Implementing Traffic Management plans, Controlling traffic with a Stop/Slow bat, Communication in the workplace, and work safety following WHS policies and procedures.

On completion, Shaun commenced with Winun Ngari working on the Gibb River Road construction in Traffic Management until November 2018.

In April 2019, Shaun commenced casual work with Maca Civil, through Winun Ngari's 'West Kimberley Labour Hire' company in various roles across the Kimberley.

Shaun's commitment, dedication, work ethic and ability to work on his own has provided him the offer of a full time traineeship with Maca Civil which will commence in early October 2020.

Winun Ngari and Frilled Enterprises are very proud of Shaun's achievements and we wish him well in his new role and know that he will achieve even greater outcomes with Maca Civil.

LORE, CULTURE AND OUR TRADITIONS

Lore, culture and our traditions are unique to Wandjina People and central to their lives and how they look after the land and water. For them, it includes, their stories about country, the traditional names for places, their customs and dances. Wandjina People have a strong connection to culture and country. This connection and knowledge is passed down from elders to the younger generation through story and song. The young generation carries the responsibility to pass knowledge on to future generations. They often practice Junba culture songs and dances.

Junba are corroborees that tell stories relating to Ngarinyin, Worrorra and Wunambul Culture. It brings together elders and youth. It is a way of keeping up the health and well-being of people, language and culture. We take our elders on country to share their wealth of knowledge with the younger generation in order to preserve and pass on knowledge. Song and Dance is very important to ensure our culture is thriving. Some young people know some words in language of songs, but modern-day distractions keep them from learning. We want to build on these projects and bring this knowledge together for future generations.
